On May 7, 2015, the Board directed staff to provide monthly reports of the District's water use, water savings projects, and activities to date.

Water Use

Attached is the monthly water use report, including:

- District's Water Usage per Acre (All Funds) from Fiscal Year 2010/2011 to Fiscal Year 2020/2021 (to date and projected),
- Overall Water Costs (All Funds) from Fiscal Year 2010/2011 to Fiscal Year 2020/2021 (to date and projected),
- Rainfall to date from Fiscal Year 2010/2011 to Fiscal Year 2020/2021 (to date).

FY 2020/2021 Water Savings Projects and Activities

- Capital and Major Repair Projects
 - Annual Drought Response Irrigation Improvements – Districtwide
 - ◆ Sycamore and Glenwood Neighborhood Parks – work completed August 2020
 - ◆ Lang Ranch Neighborhood Park – work completed December 2020
- Modifying Turf Refurbishments
 - Ongoing

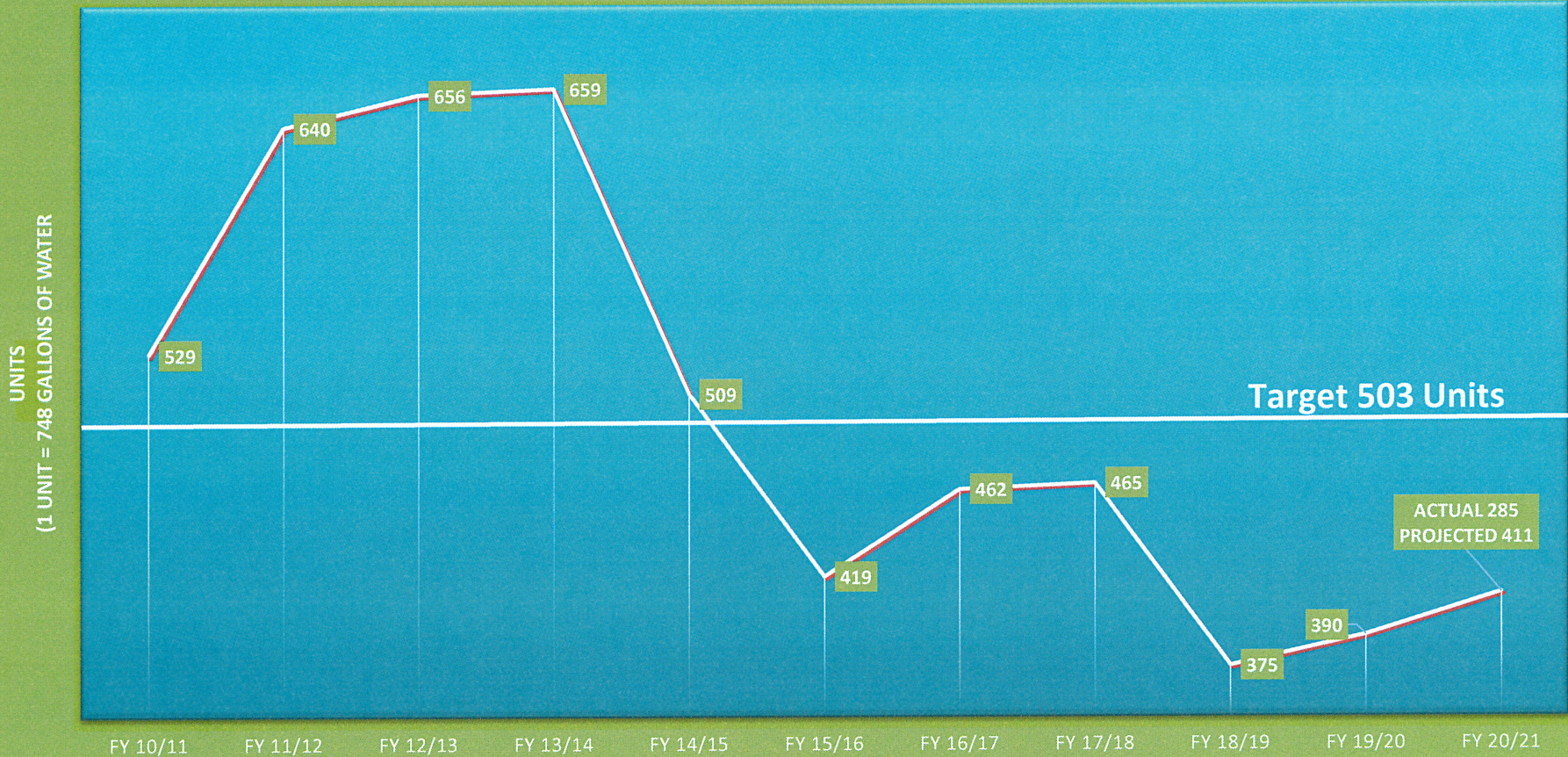
